**Lacy Landrum:** this is not to be used to cash out K time- the City will still have K time and vacation buyouts to be absorbed by the department but not with this fund.

### V. REPORTS:

- 1. Council:
  - A. Nicholas Stoulig (Not Present)

    Councilman Wells stated Mr. Stoulig wanted a flag for the City of Hammond this will be discussed later.

**B.** Demetrius Carter: stated he came before the Council last year concerning the demolition scope of work and what needs to be done. The paperwork that the contractors need to go by has not been put together for contractors to go by for demolitions and as a contractor we need that so everyone would be on the same page. Also, he mentioned not receiving the correct information from the City. Stated he would like to know where the City is at with providing this information.

Mayor, stated demolitions will now go through purchasing as with all other bids and the City Attorney will be involved with documents and thinks this will be clarified.

**Lacy Landrum**, City will have a checklist for demolition and if you win that project you will receive a letter that will give you notice about a notice to proceed of a start date and when you need to be finished. There will be also be a pre demolition meeting with the contractor that wins each project that consists of someone in Code Enforcement to confirm the address, the location, and confirm the checklist. If any changes need to be made during process we can us a Change Order process.

Councilman Wells, we're still doing it the old way and wants to see how the construction is done.

Councilwoman Gonzales, asked that the checklist be sent to the Council so they will know how it works

**C. Jamal Mosley:** informed the Council that he was the contractor that tore down the wrong house. There were 2 houses at the same location and he was told to go by the address for demolition and he tore down the home with that address and has not been paid for the work. He stated he submitted the lowest bid for last round of demotion work and was told all bids were rejected. He lost money because he rented storage units and put together a crew but work was not awarded due to all bids were rejected.

**Bobby Mitchell, City Code Enforcement Officer** stated there were confusions between contractors but not the City. There were 2 houses on the same lot 2413 Center the blue house was on the picture that was provided to the Council and all contractors and in the bids - but the brown house was torn down. He stated Mr. Mosley should have raised questions with the City before he tore it down.

**Jamal Mosley**, stated it wasn't clear which location because it was by the picture or address – he asked prior to starting asked go by picture or address and was told address. He informed the Council he has spent money on a location not being clear of the address and on bids that were rejected and lost money on both ends.

Lacy Landrum, stated you had not received the demolition permit

**Jamal Mosley**, stated he applied for the bid and was waiting for permit and also preparing for the project not aware the bids were going to be rejected.

**Councilwoman Gonzales**, stated as to what you lost Mr. Mosley in your claim, the Council cannot award you money you should speak with the Administration and Legal to see if any of that money is recoverable

**Attorney, Andre Coudrain,** stated the City cannot pay something that's not due. In this case the wrong house was torn down but it was not because of misinformation provided by the City it was acknowledged by the contractor that there was a discrepancy and it should have been cleared up by the contractor with the City before the house was torn down. On the other expenses occurred, this was before Mr. Mosley received the demolition permit from the City, so this was the contractors' risk.

Question from Public Online: were you notified by the City that you were awarded the recent bid

Jamal Mosley: yes

Lacy Landrum: stated there was not an official letter or permit

Councilman Wells, asked Mr. Mosley how know you were awarded the bids

Jamal Mosley, stated he received a text saying won the bids

**Bobby Mitchell**, by request, he sent out text if contractors are not in attendance of what the bids opening were, they will send a copy of the list of bids. This is to just to verify the numbers, not to start the work.

Councilman Andrews, stated it sounds to him that receiving that text just gave them the ok but would want this process to be clear for the contractors

**Jamal Mosley** stated Mr. Mitchell stated they will try to recover money back and he didn't know if it was going to be from the City or the owners of 2413 Center Street.

Bobby Mitchell stated he informed Mr. Mosley he could speak with the owners of 2413 Center to recover his funds due to him tearing the wrong house down.

#### 2. Mayor:

#### A. Amwaste Report: Representatives are present from Amwaste

**Mayor**, stated the City recycles twice a month and Amwaste contracts for curbside pickup for recycling and the City received complaints on recycling. The City also has issues with trash pickup.

**Dustin Fortenberry, District Manager Amwaste: 732 East Railroad Ave., Independence** is familiar with the City work and with prior administration- the biggest change was recycling. There is an increase in volume since March and that increases route times. The second hurdle is the number of employees to work - it's hard to get employees. There are also mechanical issues to keep equipment serviced. We're working hard to provide the service and think there have been improvements and brought in new equipment. He thinks recycling needs to be changed - the old system is not working because only 30% is sellable the rest goes to landfill but AmWaste will still pickup recycling until system can be changed.

Councilman DiVittorio, stated he has not received any complaints this week

**Councilman Wells** stated he appreciates what they are doing in district #3 and talked to the employees who work on the truck and they said there is more trash.

# Mr. Dustin Fortenberry left cards with his phone number

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Councilman DiVittorio, stated he received a call about a development on Natchez and Corbin and it's a tax credit development called the Burrow – he has talked to residents who oppose the development. He wants to address this before it gets carried away.

**Tracie Shillace**, stated she received a phone call from the developer and they were putting together a site plan to present it to the Planning Commission and they will try to get on the September agenda.

Lacy Landrum, stated there are 3 possible developments and these developments did not apply to the Louisiana Housing Corporation for building permits - they are approved for tax credits not permits.

Councilman DiVittorio, the City and residents need to be notified and asked that a public hearing be held to review and discuss.

Lacy Landrum, stated we need to have information on projects to have public hearing.

Tracie Schillace, stated no public hearing has been set

**Mayor**, Friday July 31, 2020 from 9 to 12 at Hammond Westside there will be the Back Pack giveaway drive thru. The Police & Fire Millage vote is important for people to go out and vote.

Lacy Landrum, stated the election is August 15 - early voting has started and goes on for the next two weeks it is a renewal not a new tax.

This should be about preservation of the building. This is not about Economic Development - the guidelines were not followed. She asked the Council to to overturn thedecision.
